### **1. Olympiad winner's skill set**

To win the Olympiad, you should have a firm grasp of linguistic concepts, namely:

- key terms and concepts related to linguistic phenomena at different language levels;
- different argumentation strategies, as well as fixed formulas of speaking etiquette;
- basic literary techniques, tropes, and figures of speech;
- types of languages, the interdependence of language with thought, society and culture;
- Russian and/or English language at C1–C2 level.

You should also have a solid command of the following skills:

- analyze texts in Russian and English in terms of their speech culture and grammar;
- analyze phonetic, morphological, lexical, syntactic and stylistic features of written text;
- build communication argumentatively in accordance with the standard of Russian and / or English literary language;
- do literary analysis of the text, demonstrating the formation of ideas about the figurative and expressive possibilities of the Russian and / or English language;
- do linguistic analysis of the text, taking into account the type of language, its structure, semantics and pragmatics, as well as the social and cultural characteristics of the addressee.
