

Program: Education & Psychology

This document outlines the scope of themes that may be included in the Olympiad tests. The themes are grouped by areas and are followed by the list of recommended references in the Russian and English languages.

1. Olympiad winner's skill set by Subject

To win the Olympiad in Education and Psychology, you must display a good grasp of knowledge, skills and competencies. You are expected to:

be familiar with the theoretical foundations of pedagogy and psychology, fundamental models of educational systems, the core concepts of both domestic and international approaches, principles governing the interaction between educational organizations and families, management strategies for educational institutions, conflict resolution techniques, as well as fundamental methods for monitoring and assessing educational organizations;

be able to develop and analyze educational programs for different education levels, showing a solid understanding of psychological foundations; to introduce novel practice-oriented programs into the educational system; to understand the development prospects of education and psychology, and anticipate problems and risks associated with these fields; to carry out analytical activities in education and psychology; to assess and resolve conflict situations in the educational process; to model pedagogical situations and relationships in parent and coworker groups;

have **skills** in interacting with parent and coworker groups, and use professional competencies to carry out analysis, engage in project-oriented activities, and conduct research.

2. Content

4. *Basic statistical methods of data analysis.* H-index. Scopus and Elsevier databases. Journal ranking.

1. *Laws and dynamics of child's mental development.* Problems of age periodization of child development. Age crises as natural mental development stages. Age-related neoformations and the ways to address them within the educational system.

2. *Readiness for school education.* Psychology of early and preschool childhood. Psychology of the younger schoolchild. Psychology of adolescents and older schoolchildren.
3. *Applied aspects of pedagogical psychology.* Research methods in pedagogical psychology. Laws of the assimilation process. Learning and development. Cognitive approaches to learning. Humanistic approaches to teaching. Motivation and teaching.

5. *Needs analysis.* Designing learning objectives and outcomes. The concept of competencies. General cultural competencies. Professional competences.
6. *Design of educational technologies and training task development.* Development of test tasks and evaluation systems. Fishbowl strategy, Six Thinking Hats, Jigsaw. Brainstorming techniques.

The problem of communication in psychology.
